If Education is the sum of one's experience, then the year 1967, being a year of unusually active involvement for both staff and students, was a highly potential year for growth. I use the term growth in the broadest possible sense, to mean the formulation of a philosophy of life which allows one to live in equilibrium with one's environment. The evaluation of change is directly related to your philosophy of life, your scale of values, without which you cannot evaluate. If you cannot evaluate, then you are in danger of misinterpreting progressiveness as permissiveness, freedom as license, humanism as weakness, democracy as equality, life as death In all fairness, I should point out that you can be very successful without a scale of values -- but this will depend on your criterion of success.

Whether you got your money's worth out of this message I leave, therefore, for you to evaluate!
