If you cannot evaluate, then you are in danger of misinterpreting progressiveness as permissiveness, freedom as license, humanism as weakness, democracy as equality, life as death . . . . . . In all fairness, I should point out that you can be very successful without a scale of values -- but this will depend on your criterion of success.

Whether you got your money's worth out of this message I leave, therefore, for you to evaluate!
